1) CORPORATE NEWS

Elections

Archibald Warnock (YHS 71) was elected to replace retiring President Marie-Anne STARNS Lillis (YHS 72), and Ralph Oser (Friend) was elected to the Board of Directors for a three-year term.

AFYHS OnLine

Despite the inevitable delays one can expect when undertaking a volunteer project of this scope, the first module, a secure on-line address book which members will be able to maintain in real time from all over the globe is slated for this Winter. Once the first module is developed and implemented, we're planning on providing members with the ability to email their friends directly, without regard to their graduating class.

Class Chat Lists

Although several thousand email addresses of YHS alums were provided to the individual class chat list moderators last Fall, few have been posted to the class chat lists. We've found that although the Yahoo Groups chat lists are free, they are cumbersome to administer, especially for those called on to do so only occasionally. As described below we are exploring simpler options now, and will start implementation later this winter.

All moderators will continue monitoring their lists - only the source of the technology is will change as we migrate to email lists running under our own yorktownalums.org domain. Although most class chat lists are now active, those few classes without a moderator will remain inactive. We will not expose alums from the classes without a moderator to spam and unsolicited commercial emails, and will only active a dormant list when we can insure that the lists are only populated by classmates and that they are not used for private marketing purposes. We trust you agree and will consider helping as warranted.

As always, if you do not want to be listed, or contacted by us, please complete the Opt-Out form on our website and mail it to us and we'll disassociate you from your class lists, and from the database listing.

In time we hope to permit online record updates, reunion & other event management, and management of the Hall of Fame by booster clubs on line. Stay tuned - it's going to get a lot better in the next year or so.

Website

We appear to have our website working properly again thanks to the efforts of Webmaster Archie Warnock (YHS 71). One change you will note is that we have opened up access to materials which were formerly restricted to members only. Access to reunion resources is still restricted, however, and additional "members only" content will be added in the future.

The first additional offering for members will be the online address book, mentioned above, which we hope to have tested and debugged this quarter. We plan to grant dues-paying members a year's worth of access to this resource, and have therefore not sought dues renewals.

Supporting Yorktown Programs

One again we supported the Yorktown High School Dance Team with ads in the YHS Football program they produce. We also posted information from the Band on their beautiful poinsettias they sell every year, and hope to get the word out earlier next Fall. We'll be in contact with the Yearbook staff shortly to support that prized activity. Unfortunately, the PTA revoked the cost-sharing agreement we had negotiated two years ago, and the Crew Boosters rejected our offer to coordinate fund-raising efforts. Our Endowed Crew Equipment Fund will therefore continue.

Other programs in need of financial support are encouraged to contact us to discuss your needs and how we might be of help within the constraints of our limited budget, and we extend our offer to include all unincorporated school-based activities under our corporate umbrella to free scarce volunteer time for programmatic purposes, while we provide the administrative support. Interested booster-group leaders are encouraged to contact us to discuss how this might benefit your program.

3) YORKTOWN HAPPENINGS

Yorktown scores in the top 5 local schools in this year's Washington Post Challenge, which ranks all public Metro DC High Schools (excluding magnet schools with competitive admissions). The index is calculated by dividing the number of graduation seniors by the number of students taking Advanced Placement (i.e. college-level) courses. Yorktown ranked fourth out of 155 local high schools, and was the highest ranked Arlington High School.

A scholarship in memory of YHS Registrar **Lillian Day** was created at the Arlington Community Foundation. Details can be obtained from that organization once we receive their permission for us to include this information.

We are still collecting funds towards the award of our first Annual and Endowed merit scholarships. Information on these funds, and how to make your tax deductible contribution are on our website, as is information on corporate matching of your gifts.

We all have busy schedules, and sharing the load makes it easier on other volunteers who have graciously agreed to help.

A number of new members and alums have updated their records since the first of the year. We are behind getting that information posted. Please bear with us, or offer to help so we can get you included more quickly. We are working on a better system for our chat lists and it will be implemented in the coming weeks.

Recently Activated Chat List

YHS70 thanks to volunteer moderator Peter J. Chaves who has graciously agreed to serve his classmates in this capacity. Several others inquired about being their class chat list moderator in November and December. While most of the class chat lists are now activated, almost none are fully populated with emails of classmates. Part of the reason for this is that, while free, the yahoo groups are somewhat cumbersome to administer.

So for those receiving this through your class chat list, remember to thank your class moderator(s) for getting things working properly. Because of these difficulties, we are currently investigating implementing class chat lists as email lists under our own yorktownalums.org

domain. Early tests are promising, and may result in our phasing out most of the yahoogroups lists in favor of lists over which we have more administrative control. Stay tuned.
